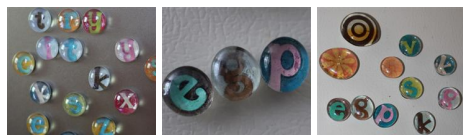

## CRICUT®: WHAT WAS USED



Alphalicious Cartridge



Cricut Expression® 2

## OTHER MATERIALS NEEDED

card stock

clear flat backed stones

magnets

modge podge

scissors

### STEP 1

I cut A-Z in 1" lowercase Alphalicious.

### STEP 2

Cover the front and back of the letter in modge podge and adhere BACKWARDS on the flat side of the clear stone.

### STEP 3

Using a contrasting color of card stock, I cut a circle (free hand will work) and adhered that to the stone on top of the backwards letter. Seal with another coat of modge podge.

## STEP 4

Hot glue a small magnet on the back!

## STEP 5

You can use patterned paper for this as well!
