My daughter's Christmas stocking looked so plain. It needed some character! So I used my Cricut, Folk Art Festival and heat-transfer vinyl to add to some color to it.

## STEP 1

I used the Folk Art Festival cartridge to cut all shapes and fonts and heat-transfer vinyl. First, I chose the design I wanted to put on the stocking and decided what size I wanted it to be. Next, I cut the name from red glitter heat-transfer vinyl using the basic font on the Folk Art cartridge.

## STEP 2

Then, I cut the dove and the word "Peace" from white stripflock heat-transfer vinyl. I then weeded out the unnecessary vinyl and the vinyl filling the holes of the letters and the details in the dove. I used the two tulips cut in the dove on each side of the word "Peace".

## STEP 3

Last, I ironed on the cuts, using an iron set to cotton for about 15 seconds each. I hung it up in its place and now have a pretty, customized Christmas stocking!

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
