## OTHER MATERIALS NEEDED

Foam squares

Adhesive

Red cardstock (1)

Green cardstock (1)

White cardstock (1)

## STEP 1

Cricut® Cuts:

Plantin Schoolbook Cartridge

1. Circle

a. Red circle (4 3/4" <circle>)

b. White circle (4 3/4" Shadow + <circle>)

When It's Cold Outside Cartridge

2. Nativity snowflake

a. White snowflake (4 1/2" <Nativity>)

Wild Card

3. Phrase: Merry Christmas

a. White phrase (4" Phrase + <Ornament>)

## STEP 2

Use paper trimmer to cut one 7 1/4" x 11" piece of red cardstock. Fold in half to create card base.

## STEP 3

Use paper trimmer to cut one 5 1/4" x 7" piece of green cardstock. Adhere to card front.

## STEP 4

Use paper trimmer to cut one 4 3/4" x 1 3/4" piece of white cardstock and one 4 1/2" x 1 1/2" piece of red cardstock. Layer together. Use foam squares to adhere to card front.

## STEP 5

Create circle from cuts 1a-1b. Layer together. Use foam squares to adhere to card front.

## STEP 6

Create snowflake from cut 2a. Use foam squares to adhere to card front.

## STEP 7

Create phrase from cut 3a. Adhere to card front.

## STEP 8

Embellish as desired.
