

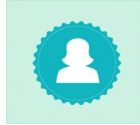

OTHER MATERIALS NEEDED

Artiste cartridge

Cranberry and Olive and Kraft cardstock

Twine

Red glitter

Sentiment stamp

Joys of the Season cartridge

Cranberry and Chocolate ink

Bells

Adhesive pearls

PROJECT CUT FILES

STEP 1

Cut base from Artiste at 2.5 inches, score and fold, ink edges with chocolate ink.

STEP 2

Stamp sentiment in cranberry ink.

STEP 3

Cut flowers at 1.25, 1.5, 1.75, 2 inches. Score down the middle of the petals, ink with chocolate ink, and pinch and fold edges upward. Then layer pieces from largest to smallest and add an adhesive pearl.

STEP 4

Cut holly leaves from Joys of the Season at 2.5 inches, ink edges, crease leaves. Add red glitter if using alone or don't if adding a flower.

STEP 5

Tie bells at each end of twine and wrap around the base 3 times and tie in a bow. The twine is about 27" long. Attach flower, holly leaf with glitter, or both.

STEP 6

Add napkin, utensils and candy cane. Then you are finished!
